Election Results

According to the Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State, incumbent Mayor Kirt Briggs was re-elected to a third term as mayor.

City Councilmember Kevin Burkart challenged Briggs and with all precincts reporting, Briggs earned 54 percent of the vote and Burkart received 45 percent.

Burkart's open City Council seat will be filled by Ethan Hellier. Hellier ran unopposed, as did City Council member Zach Braid, who was re-elected to his third term. Current terms expire on Dec. 31, 2024, and the four-year new terms being Jan. 1, 2025. Mayor and City Council members serve staggered four-year terms.

Thank you to all of the dedicated poll workers. Their hard work and commitment ensure that our elections are fair, accessible, and run smoothly.

The City of Prior Lake has completed and submitted its water service line materials inventory to the Minnesota Department of Health. 
